TO THE BIBLE - 2 Corinthians 3:5 NKJV

"Not that we are sufficient of ourselves to think of anything as being from ourselves, but our sufficiency is from God."

LET'S TALK



The Apostle Paul declares in 2 Corinthians 3:5 NKJV, "...our sufficiency is from God." The Greek word translated sufficiency is "hikanotēs", meaning "competence" or "ability". This means as a child of God, you're not ordinary; your competence is divine. As you journey into this new year, approach it with this consciousness. Your goals, dreams, and aspirations must be seen through the ability of God at work in you. You're not limited to natural strength or human intellect; the Spirit of God has infused you with His wisdom and excellence.

This is why it matters what you say. Knowledge alone doesn't establish divine reality; affirmation does. The Word must be on your lips. Declare often: "My sufficiency is of God. I function with divine competence. I accomplish my dreams with excellence and fulfil every vision by the power of the Spirit." Each time you affirm this truth, you align your spirit with God's Word. The Holy Spirit then guides your thoughts, inspires your creativity, and opens opportunities that position you for success. You'll find yourself walking in paths that manifest God's power and ability in you.

Understand also that growth is progressive. Competence in every area may not appear at once, but consistency in your confession and sensitivity to the Spirit

will bring steady advancement. Each step you take will reveal more of God’s ability in you until your life becomes the unfolding of His wisdom and glory.

So, as you embrace 2026, set your vision high. Don’t think small. Don’t plan as one who is limited. Your sufficiency is of God, and with His competence at work in you, every dream is possible, every goal attainable, and every vision achievable.

TO THE BIBLE - Ephesians 2:10 NKJV

"For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them."

LET'S TALK



Romans 8:29 (NLT) says, *"For God knew his people in advance, and he chose them to become like his Son..."* Predestination is at work in you. God has a divine plan for your life, and He has set events and their sequence in motion in line with His divine plan.

Think about John the Baptist. His entire calling was to reveal Jesus to Israel. Yet God didn't simply tell him who the Messiah was. Instead, John had to wait for the sign: *"...The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and remain is the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit."* (John 1:33 NIV). When Jesus finally stood before him, the moment unfolded exactly as God planned (John 1:29–34).

Or consider Samuel's mission to anoint Israel's new king (1 Samuel 16). He thought Eliab, Jesse's tall and impressive son, was the one. But God corrected him: *"People look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart."* 1 Samuel 16:7 (NIV). One by one, Jesse's sons were rejected until David—the forgotten shepherd boy—was brought in. Then the Lord said, *"Rise and anoint him; this is the one."* 1 Samuel 16:12 (NIV). Step by step, God's plan came into focus.

In the same way, God has a plan for your life, and it's a good one. He has already set the path and the sequence

of events that will shape you into who He has called you to be. You don't have to panic or force things to happen. What matters is that you stay yielded to Him, trusting His timing.

Ephesians 2:10 (AMP) says, *"For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus... so that we would walk in them [living the good life which He prearranged and made ready for us]."* This year, walk boldly in the path God has marked out for you. It's already prepared, and it leads to His glory in your life.

CONSULT WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT

(He Knows The Details)



TO THE BIBLE - Romans 8:26 NKJV

"Likewise the Spirit also helps in our weaknesses. For we do not know what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered."

LET'S TALK



In our last study, we saw that God has already marked out a predestined path for your life (Romans 8:29, Ephesians 2:10). The question then is, *how do you walk that path with accuracy?* The answer is simple: by the Spirit.

Life is filled with choices—some minor, others defining. Opportunities will open before you this year, and you may ask yourself: Should I take this step? Is this the right path? The good news is that you're not left to guess. The Holy Spirit knows the details. He sees beyond what you can perceive and knows the path of success and victory.

Romans 8:26 NKJV tells us that *"the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered."* When you pray in the Spirit, the Holy Ghost grants to you God's counsel and unveils the precise course you must follow. There's so much you don't know about the year ahead—the people you'll meet, the places you'll go, the decisions you'll face. Yet, the Holy Spirit knows them all. He knows and understands the fine details – things about your life and the things beyond human perception – and He intercedes for you accordingly.

This is why prayer in the Spirit is indispensable. When you pray in the Spirit, you align yourself with God's

perfect plan. Instead of confusion, you receive clarity. Instead of struggling in uncertainty, you walk in divine precision. As you set your vision for the year, refuse to grope in the dark. Engage the Spirit in fellowship; pray much in tongues. Yield to His guidance, and every day of 2026 will unfold with the accuracy of God’s design.

BE RESOLUTE

(Stay Focused On The Divine Mission)

TO THE BIBLE - John 12:49 NKJV

"For I have not spoken on My own authority; but the Father who sent Me gave Me a command, what I should say and what I should speak."

LET'S TALK



The Lord Jesus was resolute about His purpose. He knew why He came and never allowed distractions. He declared, *"For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost"* (Luke 19:10 NKJV). In John 4:34, He said, *"...My food is to do the will of Him who sent Me, and to finish His work."* Every word, every action, was aligned with the Father's mission.

Remarkably, after fulfilling His work, He turned to us and said, *"...As the Father has sent Me, I also send you."* (John 20:21 NKJV). That means His mission has become ours. He commanded in Mark 16:15, *"Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature."* This is the divine mandate.

Matthew 24:14 NKJV gives us God's timeline: *"And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in all the world as a witness to all the nations, and then the end will come."* We're living in prophetic days—the season of "extra time." But extra time doesn't mean rest; it means urgency. It's not a break from the mission but a divine opportunity to intensify it.

The Lord Himself set the example. He said in John 8:29 NIV, *"The one who sent me is with me; he has not left me alone, for I always do what pleases him."* Our lives

must echo the same commitment. Success in God's eyes is not measured by human applause but by faithfulness to His instruction. Your accountability will be on the basis of your participation in the Gospel.

So, resolve to stay focused. Let your speech, your actions, and your priorities all mirror the Master's commitment. Preach the Gospel everywhere, every day, with the consciousness that necessity is laid upon you. Nothing in this world is more important than this.

IT'S A MESSAGE THAT WORKS

Produces Undeniable Results)

TO THE BIBLE - Romans 1:16 NKJV

"For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes..."

LET'S TALK



Having established the need to be resolute about the divine mission, there's something even more inspiring I want you to see: the message we carry is not empty; it produces results. It's the reason you must be quick and bold to share it with others.

The Gospel of Jesus Christ isn't mere words—it produces undeniable results for anyone who believes. I once ministered to a man with a severe heart condition. Doctors had diagnosed him with heart failure and recommended a transplant. As I shared the Gospel with him, I said, *"While I'm talking to you, a change will take place in your heart. Just believe it."* He agreed. After a few minutes of sharing the Word, I declared, "It's done." He responded, "Yes, it's done." Tests later confirmed it—he had a new heart!

I've seen this happen several times. It doesn't matter what the case is; this Gospel works. The Bible says, ***"Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever"*** (Hebrews 13:8 NKJV). If He did it then, He's still doing it now. The message has no borders. It works in every country, every city, and for everyone who believes. It transforms lives, brings healing and health to the sick, prosperity to the poor, and salvation to the lost.

How can we be quiet about such a message that

transforms destinies and catapults men and women from despair to victory? Paul said in Romans 1:16 (NKJV), *"For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek."* Therefore, preach the Gospel boldly. The message works every time, everywhere, and for everyone who believes. Hallelujah!

TO THE BIBLE - Mark 9:23 NKJV

"Jesus said to him, 'If you can believe, all things are possible to him who believes.'"

LET'S TALK



As a sequel to our previous article—*"It's a Message That Works"*—it's important to understand how to position yourself for the results the Gospel produces. The principle is clear: believe. To believe is to accept God's Word as absolute truth and to act accordingly.

What a statement from the lips of the Master in our opening scripture above! Notice the profound but very simple instruction: *"Only believe."* He says ALL things are possible to you if you believe. What does it take to believe? It simply means to accept that what the Lord has said is true.

The story of Jairus in Mark 5 illustrates this perfectly. His daughter was at the point of death, and he urgently sought the Lord's help. But while they were still on the way, the news came that the child had died. Jesus immediately said to him, *"Don't be afraid; just believe"* (Mark 5:36 NIV). At Jairus' house, the Lord took the girl by the hand and said, *"Little girl, I say to you, get up!"* (Mark 5:41 NLT). Instantly, she rose to life. What made the difference? Jairus refused to succumb to fear; he chose to accept the Master's words as truth. That's faith. Faith is the response of the human spirit to the Word of God.

This year, anchor your life on the authority of God's Word. When He speaks concerning your health, your

success, or your future, affirm it boldly: "Yes, Lord, this is truth, and it's working in my life." That unwavering response ushers you into a realm of limitless possibilities where all things are possible.

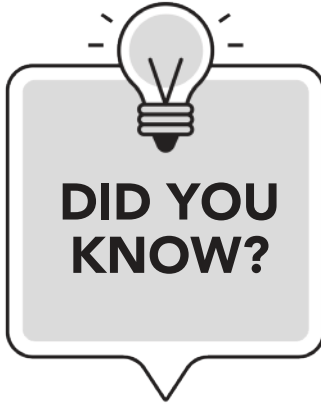

Amazing Facts About Ants

It's amazing how much we can learn from such a tiny creature. In fact, the Bible itself points us to the ant as an example of wisdom and diligence: *"Go to the ant, you sluggard; consider its ways and be wise!"* (Proverbs 6:6, NIV). The next time you see ants marching on the ground, remember — they may be small, but their discipline, teamwork, and foresight carry a message big enough to guide our own lives.

Here are seven simple things about ants that can inspire you:

1. Teamwork makes them strong.

One ant can only do a little, but together they can carry loads much bigger than themselves.

2. They never give up.

Block their path, and ants quickly find another way. They remind us to keep going, no matter what obstacles come.

3. They prepare for the future.

Ants gather food in the summer so they will have enough in the winter. They live with tomorrow in mind.

4. Every ant has a purpose.

Some protect, some gather food, and one is queen. Each ant has an important role to play, just like people do.

5. They are incredibly strong.

Ants can carry up to 50 times their own weight. They prove that strength isn't about size but determination.

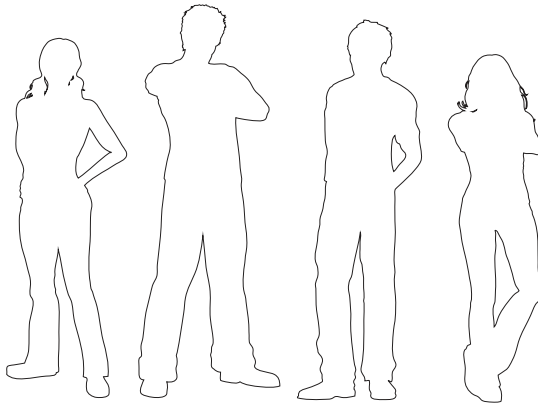
6. They live almost everywhere.

7. They are disciplined.

TO THE BIBLE - Colossians 3:1-2 NIV

"Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things."

LET'S TALK



If you've ever gone mountain climbing, one of the most fascinating things you'll discover is how insignificant everything below seems. From above, the tallest buildings shrink, the busiest roads fade, and what once demanded attention becomes insignificant. There's a higher realm of life to which we've been called in Christ Jesus. It's a place of glory and dominion, far above the distractions and limitations of this world. The Word declares, *"Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things"* (Colossians 3:2 NIV). This is the mountaintop life.

It brings to mind something remarkable that the Lord told me many years ago; He said, "Son, see from the mountaintop." The interesting thing is, I didn't even realise I was on the mountaintop until He told me. I know that some Christians say they are "journeying" and trying to get to the mountaintop. But being born again, you're on the mountaintop. You're risen with Christ and are seated together with Him, far above principalities and powers. Therefore, see from there. Live from there.

From the mountaintop, your vision is clear. You see victory, strength, health, prosperity, and continual progress. You're above the distractions and limitations of the world.

You're in the realm of the Spirit, where all you see is glory. Ponder again what we read in Colossians 3:2 (NIV), "*Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things.*" Your thoughts, desires, focus and devotion should be directed towards heavenly realities, not earthly distractions. Align your mind with the heavenly perspective and live victoriously every day.

TO THE BIBLE - 1 John 5:4 NKJV

"For whatever is born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith."

LET'S TALK



As a child, your parents made decisions for you. They decided where you lived, what school you went to, and even what food you ate. Even the Lord Jesus experienced this. For instance, when He was born, He was laid in a manger—not by His choice, but by His parents' decision. Later, when Herod sought to kill Him, the angel did not speak to Jesus but to Joseph, saying, "...Arise, take the young Child and His mother, flee to Egypt" (Matthew 2:13 NKJV). The Lord Jesus did not decide this; He was carried along as a child.

Even as He grew, He remained subject to Joseph and Mary. But when He became a man, He took responsibility for His own life and purpose. Moses also, when he came of age, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter (Hebrews 11:24). In the same way, you must take charge of your life. Over the years, I have taught God's people all around the world that though you may not have been responsible for the family into which you were born, nor for the circumstances that surrounded your birth, you are absolutely responsible for the life you choose to live when you come to maturity and the age of accountability.

You can't allow your environment, the economy, or the opinions of others dictate how you live. Choose victory

every day. Determine to succeed in all that you do because that is the life you have in Christ. The Bible says, *"But thanks be to God, Who in Christ always leads us in triumph [as trophies of Christ's victory] and through us spreads and makes evident the fragrance of the knowledge of God everywhere"* (2 Corinthians 2:14 AMPC). And again, *"For whatever is born of God is victorious over the world..."* (1 John 5:4 AMPC).

You're born of God and have overcome the world. You're victorious in Christ. Therefore, choose to live victoriously every day. Live above the systems of this world.

They say things like, "We are all human" or "Nobody is perfect." But these are excuses that keep them living below the divine life God has given us in Christ. The Bible tells us, *"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new"* (2 Corinthians 5:17 NKJV).

When you were born again, you became a new person—no longer just human, but born of God. You're now a partaker of the divine nature (2 Peter 1:4). So when someone says "Nobody is perfect," remember the words of Jesus: *"Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect"* (Matthew 5:48 NIV). Perfection here means to be full-grown in maturity, blameless, unspotted, wanting nothing; a completeness. This is the life Christ has made possible for you.

Another phrase you often hear is *"We all make mistakes."* But God's Word shows us something different: *"Whoever has been born of God does not sin, for His seed remains in him; and he cannot sin, because he has been born of God"* (1 John 3:9 NKJV). The very life of God in you

empowers you to live above sin, above failure, and above limitation. Don't let human traditions or negative ideas shape how you see yourself. God's Word is your truth.

In Christ, you've been called to a life of excellence, righteousness, dominion, and victory over every circumstance. This is your reality. Refuse to accept mediocrity or failure. Look to the Word, believe it, and live by it. We'll delve more into this in our next study.

PERFECT AND COMPLETE

LET'S TALK



Growth is God's design. Everything He created is made to grow, to advance, and to reach fullness. The seed becomes a tree. The child becomes an adult. In the same way, God expects His children to grow into spiritual maturity.

The Apostle Paul wrote about Epaphras, who prayed fervently for the Christians in Colossae, *"that ye may stand perfect and complete in all the will of God"* (Colossians 4:12 NKJV). Notice the Spirit's desire: perfection and completeness. The words "perfect," Greek (*teleios*), and "complete," Greek (*plēroō*), in this context are synonymous and often used interchangeably in the Scriptures to specifically refer to being full-grown or mature. They denote a state of spiritual maturity where one becomes a full-grown Christian.

Just as earthly parents raise their children to be responsible and able to take on life, God also desires for you to be mature and take responsibilities in the Kingdom, influence others, and establish His righteousness in the earth. He doesn't want you tossed about by circumstances or deceived by false ideas. He wants you strong, discerning, and fruitful. 2 Timothy 3:17 NKJV says, *"That the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work."* Maturity in Christ means reaching a level where you

are grounded in the Word, able to discern God's will, and fully equipped to carry out His purposes. James 1:4 says, *"But let patience have its perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing."*

This is God's will and desire for His children. Ephesians 4:13 (AMPC) says, *"...until we all attain oneness in the faith and in the comprehension of the [full and accurate] knowledge of the Son of God, that [we might arrive] at really mature manhood (the completeness of personality which is nothing less than the standard height of Christ's own perfection)"* Blessed be God!

WORDS ARE NOT ENOUGH

(Your Devotion To The Lord Must Be Met With Words And Actions)



TO THE BIBLE - 1 Thessalonians 1:5 NKJV

"For our gospel did not come to you in word only, but also in power, and in the Holy Spirit and in much assurance, as you know what kind of men we were among you for your sake."

LET'S TALK



There's a reason people often say, "Actions speak louder than words." Think about a friend who promises to always be there for you, but when the time comes, they fail to show up. Their words lose meaning because there's no action to back them.

In many contexts in Scriptures, we see how God gave us the precedence of words and actions going together. For example, Genesis 2:7 tells us, "And the LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul." He didn't use words only in creating man. The Apostle John, in 1 John 3:18, admonishes us, *"My little children, let us not love in word, neither in tongue; but in deed and in truth."* It's not enough to say, "I love the Lord," or "I love people." Love is proven in action. It's demonstrated.

Even in thanksgiving, we don't just say, "Thank you, Lord." We show it. We lift our voices in worship, yes, but we also present offerings to the Lord, we serve, and we give of ourselves. The Scriptures are replete with this principle: the Word must be backed by action for it to produce results in your life. In 1 Thessalonians 1:5, as read in the theme verse, we see that the Gospel didn't come to the Christians in Thessalonica in word only but in power and in the Holy Ghost. Our preaching must be accompanied by the power

of the Holy Spirit.

Likewise, James teaches us it's the doer of the Word who is blessed, not the hearer only (James 1:22–25). Even the Lord Jesus Himself rebuked those whose worship was only lip service, saying, *"These people draw near to Me with their mouth, and honor Me with their lips, but their heart is far from Me."* (Matthew 15:8 NKJV). Words alone, without corresponding action, are insufficient in expressing our devotion to the Lord. It also reminds of what the Bible says about faith without works or corresponding action—it's dead: "For as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also" (James 2:26 NKJV).

LET'S TALK



Some years ago, I watched a little child mimic her mother's words with such passion—even though she didn't yet understand what those words meant. But soon enough, as the days passed, she began to respond, communicate, and even instruct using the very words she had heard. That's the mystery of sound coding—the assignment of meaning, interpretation, and communication of sound or the cognitive process for the creation of sound.

In the beginning, God set this eternal principle in motion. He didn't just think creation into existence; He spoke it. "Then God said, *"Let there be light"; and there was light.*" (Genesis 1:3 NKJV). Why did He speak? Because words are carriers of divine energy. They aren't mere sounds; they are codes—sound codes—that embed instruction, meaning, and purpose into creation itself. When you teach a child a language, you are transferring sound codes into that child. Over time, those codes form memory, identity, and expression. In the same way, when God spoke, He encoded creation with His divine purpose. Every tree, every star, every living thing resonates with the sound code of His Word.

Your words are not empty. They're sound codes filled with creative power. Every time you speak, you release

energy into the atmosphere. This is why the Bible declares, *"Death and life are in the power of the tongue"* (Proverbs 18:21 NKJV). Your tongue is not just for communication—it's for creation. Therefore, refuse to speak carelessly. Instead, fill your mouth with faith-filled words. Speak health to your body. Speak progress into your life. Speak peace into your home.

Remember: everything in creation responds to the sound code of your words. Just as God's Word framed the worlds, your words—spoken in faith—frame your reality today.

TO THE BIBLE - Proverbs 18:21 NKJV

"Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruit."

LET'S TALK



In our last study, we saw how sound codes carry divine energy and meaning. Today, let's take it a step further—into your very body. Years ago, a groundbreaking experiment showed the effect of words on water. Water placed in jars was exposed to different words. When kind and uplifting words like "You are beautiful, you are wonderful" were spoken, the water crystals formed into stunning, harmonious patterns. But when harsh words like "You're ugly, useless" were directed at other jars, the crystals became deformed and chaotic.

This experiment reveals a significant lesson. Recall that the human body is over seventy per cent water, which accounts for more than two-thirds of its composition. Therefore, the words you speak to yourself and your body have a tangible effect. This isn't just science; it's a spiritual law. The Bible already revealed it long ago: *"Death and life are in the power of the tongue"* (Proverbs 18:21 NKJV).

When you speak negatively to yourself—saying things like, *"This headache is killing me"* or *"I'm always sick"*—you are literally coding your body with destruction. Those words send sound codes into the water molecules in your system, disfiguring them and, over time, manifesting as sickness, weakness, or inexplicable conditions.

However, the opposite is also true! When you speak words of life, health, and strength, those same crystals

align beautifully, carrying the energy of life throughout your body. You can renew your health, strengthen your body, and invigorate your mind by the consistent release of faith-filled sound codes.

This is why you must be mindful of your speech; the crystals in your body respond to words, and your speech has the potential to heal, transform and invigorate your physical being. Take this seriously.

I once witnessed two children at play. One accidentally pushed the other, and in a flash, tears filled the boy's eyes. But before I could say a word, he smiled, reached out, and hugged his friend. No grudges, no bitterness—just love in its purest expression. How beautiful!

The Lord Jesus calls us to live this way every day—in love. He said, *"By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another"* (John 13:35 NKJV). Love is the true mark of our Christian identity. It's not how loud we pray, nor how often we attend church, but how well we love—especially when it's not convenient. Challenges will surely come. People may speak against you, hurt you, or mistreat you. Yet, the Master said, *"...love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you"* (Matthew 5:44 NKJV). That's the way of victory!

Bitterness, anger, and resentment are heavy weights. They clog the wheel of progress and hinder your growth in the spirit. No matter who it is—family, colleague, neighbour, or even a stranger—never allow bitterness a place in your heart. Instead, choose the love way. Love is not just a smile or a kind word; it's a divine force. It begins in your heart and

flows into your actions. It's seeing others the way God sees them—precious and valuable to Him. When you live this way, your life becomes an inspiration, and your impact spreads far beyond what you can imagine.

So, refuse to retaliate when insulted. Be unflustered when challenged. Like Jesus, lift your hands and say, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." Let love be your response, your language, your lifestyle. For in walking in love, you walk in the fullness of God. Hallelujah!

There's something remarkable about a man or woman who knows who they are in Christ. Such knowledge stirs an inner boldness that can't be quenched. You walk into a room, and you carry yourself with dignity, assurance, and quiet strength. Even when faced with challenges, you remain fearless because your confidence is not in the flesh but in the Spirit of God.

Think about the Lord Jesus as He stood before Pontius Pilate. He wasn't intimidated; He gave a bold testimony. Though He was the embodiment of humility, He was never fearful or unsure. That's the picture of dominion—calm, assured, yet unwavering. And this is the same life God has called you to live.

I recall, as a young schoolboy, I was bright and intelligent, yet hesitant. Even when I knew the right answers, I often kept quiet. Others, less knowledgeable but bolder, got the attention, the commendation, or the correction. But things took a different turn when I received the Holy Spirit. I lost my fears, and boldness flooded my spirit. I became audacious and unafraid to speak out.

This is exactly what God told Joshua when he was stepping into leadership: *"Only be strong and very courageous..."* (Joshua 1:7 NKJV). Strength and courage are not optional—they're vital! Many know the truth, and many have wisdom to contribute, yet fear silences them.

But those who speak—whether right or wrong—get noticed, and God can guide and refine them.

So don't shrink back. When you greet people, do it with confidence. When you speak, let your voice ring with clarity. Boldness isn't arrogance—it's a reflection of the Spirit of power within you. Balance it with humility, and you'll shine as a true ambassador of Christ.

LET'S TALK



One of the greatest blessings of our Christian journey is belonging to the body of Christ. The church is not a man-made idea; it is the living vision of the Lord Jesus Himself, who declared, *"I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it"* (Matthew 16:18 KJV). What a glorious truth! Yet, there are those who have withdrawn from fellowship because of offences—words spoken, actions taken, or misunderstandings that wounded them. Beloved, that should never be your response. Don't let anything or anyone separate you from God's house.

Often, people carry into the church the same patterns they learnt at home or in life. Some left their families because of correction or discipline they disliked, and they carry that same resistance into the household of God. But in Christ, we are called to a higher life. We receive correction with humility and guidance with joy, and we forgive quickly when offended. Why? Because salvation means Jesus is Lord. You are no longer in charge of your life; He is.

The church is divinely structured. *"And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ, till*

we all come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God..." (Ephesians 4:11-13 NKJV). This order is for your growth, maturity, and effectiveness in Christ.

So, never say, "I was offended by what the pastor said; therefore, I won't attend anymore." No! The Lord Himself leads His Church (John 10:4). When you yield to His lordship, you also yield to the structures He has set in place. Through fellowship, correction, and instruction, your spirit is trained, your mind renewed, and your walk strengthened.

Life with God is a journey of divine order. Just as a wise builder doesn't lay the roof before the foundation, so the Lord doesn't thrust His children into seasons they're not prepared for. In His love, He guides each step, ensuring that every phase equips us for greater glory.

When Israel came out of Egypt, the Lord deliberately avoided the shorter route through Philistine territory. Though quicker, it wasn't safer. They were fresh out of slavery—untrained for war and unready for confrontation. So He led them through the wilderness, where they encountered His provision and guidance. Through this journey, God revealed Himself to them as Jehovah Rapha, their physician, and Jehovah Rohi, their shepherd. When they eventually faced battles, they called Him Jehovah Nissi, their banner who gives them victory.

This is how God works with us. At times, the path may seem longer, but it is the path of preparation. Through it, He strengthens your faith, enlarges your vision, and equips you for greater victories. I recall my first crusade at just fifteen years old. Before then, I preached house to house, on the streets, and in schools—even during

workers' lunch breaks. The results were beautiful but small compared to what God is doing with me today. Back then, He didn't give me twenty thousand souls to minister to at once because I wasn't yet ready for that magnitude. Growth was necessary.

We often want things to move fast, don't we? Faster phones, faster computers. But God doesn't work according to man's timing. He works according to His divine patterns, timing and purpose, and when He brings you to that place, you'll discover that every step was necessary.

You are the blessed seed of Abraham, called not to inherit the hardship or the curse of the land, but to inherit the blessing (1 Peter 3:9).

Consider Isaac in Genesis 26. The Bible tells us there was a grievous famine in the land, yet God instructed him to remain in Gerar. Isaac acted on God's Word and sowed in that same land, and in the same year, he reaped a hundredfold, for the Lord blessed him. He waxed great and became exceedingly wealthy until a whole nation envied him. This is your story. This is your heritage.

Do not be moved by inflation or discouraged by economic downturns. Do not be tempted to seek ungodly or dishonest means to enrich yourself. Your prosperity is not in the world; it is of God. Refuse to measure your life by earthly indices. Refuse to fear. The blessing of God is upon you, and it distinguishes you.

As a young person, do not despair when you hear of financial hardship. The Bible declares that you are a

peculiar people, separated unto God. You're not subject to the limitations of this world. Rather, you function in a higher realm, where Christ is your wisdom and your sufficiency.

Therefore, declare boldly every day: "My prosperity is independent of inflation and economic conditions. I live in the abundance of God's Kingdom. I am flourishing, increasing, and excelling, for the Lord has blessed me!" Hallelujah!

The destiny of nations is not first decided in parliaments or presidential offices; it is determined in the unseen arena of the spirit. History has shown that policies may guide a nation, but it is prayer that governs its soul. The Word of God reveals to us that the quietness, peace, and prosperity many long for do not emerge by chance—they are birthed when God's people take their place in intercession.

Scripture admonishes us in 1 Timothy 2:1-2 NKJV: *"Therefore I exhort first of all that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks be made for all men, for kings and all who are in authority, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence."* This is God's blueprint for national peace.

Make it your daily culture to lift your leaders in prayer—your president, governors, lawmakers, judges, community heads, law enforcement, and all in positions of influence. Pray that God's wisdom guides their decisions, that righteousness prevails in their policies, and that peace is established in your land. The solution is not in protests or complaints, nor is it in merely changing one leader for another. True transformation begins when we, God's people, align with His Word and intercede earnestly. Create the conditions for a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty in your nation through your heartfelt prayers as directed by the Spirit.

SPREAD

To spread means to extend, enlarge, or push outward beyond previous boundaries. It describes a forceful advancement that breaks limitations and opens new territory. In Isaiah 54:2–3, the Scripture declares, *"Enlarge the place of your tent...do not hold back, for you will spread out to the right and to the left."* Here, spreading is not gradual expansion; it is a breaking forth—a release of divine power that propels you beyond every confinement.

The instruction "do not hold back" shows that spreading requires boldness. Fear, hesitation, or small thinking can restrict what grace has already empowered. The moment the Spirit moves, barriers lose their strength and nothing is capable of standing in your way.

The Scripture also reveals that spreading happens through seed. "Your seed shall inherit the nations." Seed refers to everything that proceeds from you—your words, your giving, your declarations. Words are seeds that take territories; giving is seed that lays claim on new grounds. Whatever is released from you carries the power to occupy and possess.

Therefore, spreading is intentional. As you speak, sow, and stretch forth in faith, the power of God causes you to break forth, expand, and possess cities, nations, and every space ordained for you.

I remember vividly how I once struggled with low self-esteem and lacked the confidence to express myself among my peers. Outwardly, I tried to appear bold, speaking with a certain flair, but deep inside, I felt inferior, convinced that others were smarter and better than me.

How extraordinary to know that the life we have in Christ is a life of glory. In the master's profound prayer to the Father, recorded in John 17, the Lord Jesus declared, *"And the glory which You gave Me I have given them..."* (John 17:22 NKJV). What a revelation! The very glory that the Father bestowed upon the Son, the Son has given to us.

This isn't a promise awaiting fulfilment; it's a present-hour reality. Many, out of religious sentiment, pray, *"Lord, we will not take Your glory."* But that contradicts the words of the Master Himself. He said, *"I have given them."* To deny this is to refuse what Christ has freely bestowed. In the Old Testament, the priest's garment was called the robe of glory and beauty. It symbolised righteousness, splendour, and divine acceptance. Now, we are not merely symbolically adorned—we have been clothed with Christ Himself. His glory is our garment, His righteousness our robe, His life our very essence. Blessed be God!

Walking in this glory means manifesting the excellence, beauty, and perfections of divinity. You have been called to a life of victory, abundance, health, and righteousness. It is inconsistent with the glory life to dwell in sickness, poverty, defeat, or sin. These are not reflections of the glory of God.

The Bible says, *"But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light"* (1 Peter 2:9).

Therefore, refuse to settle for anything less than the life Christ has made available. Walk in the consciousness of your glory life. Manifest His splendour everywhere, for you are His glory revealed.

A young child once stood at the door of his father's study, crying because the jar of cookies on the table seemed out of his reach. He kept calling for his father to come and get it for him. The father, however, calmly replied, "Stretch out your hand; you're tall enough to take it." And with that encouragement the boy reached out, and, to his amazement, he could take what had been his all along!

Many of God's children today live like this. They cry, plead, and even fast for God to do what He has already empowered them to do. They pray endlessly, not realising that God is waiting for them to act on the Word and exercise their authority in Christ.

Consider the account of Moses and the children of Israel at the Red Sea. Pharaoh's army advanced from behind, and the waters loomed before them. In desperation, the people cried, and Moses himself began to call upon God for intervention. But God's response was instructive: *"Why do you cry to Me? ... stretch out your hand over the sea and divide it"* (Exodus 14:15-16 NKJV).

The miracle was waiting—not on God, but on Moses. The power was present all along, but nothing happened until Moses acted. When he stretched out his hand and spoke in faith, the waters parted, and Israel walked through

on dry ground.

Beloved, God has given you His Word, His Spirit, and the authority of the Name of Jesus. Don't wait for Him to do what He's already done or what He's empowered you to do. The Apostle Paul, by the Spirit, unveils the principle in 1 Corinthians 2:12–13 NKJV: *"Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might know the things that have been freely given to us by God. These things we also speak..."*

Did you notice? It says, "We speak." The Word works when you declare it. Faith is activated when you voice what God has said concerning you. Refuse to be a hearer only; be a doer of the Word (James 1:22).

One of the surest ways to keep your body in divine health is by praying in the Holy Ghost—administering to yourself frequent doses of the Holy Ghost. The Bible says, *"But if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit who dwells in you"* (Romans 8:11 NKJV). Glory to God! This means the Holy Spirit vitalises, energises, and rejuvenates your physical body.

When you pray in tongues, the Spirit stirs the Word of God in your heart. Suddenly, faith-filled declarations burst forth: "I am of God! The greater One lives in me! He permeates every fibre of my being, every bone, every cell of my blood. He fills my head, my hands, and my feet. He perambulates my heart, my lungs, my kidneys, and my eyes. I am saturated with God! Hallelujah!"

This is not mere talk; it is the language of the Spirit. As you speak in tongues with your heart set on the power of God flowing through you, affirm: "My body is invigorated with supernatural strength! I am energised by the power of the Holy Ghost. Sickness has no place in me because I have taken hold of eternal life. I am not moved by symptoms

or circumstances. My faith is the victory that overcomes the world. I live in perpetual victory. Hallelujah!"

Charge yourself like this every day. Keep praying in tongues and declaring the Word until your body vibrates with the power of God and your atmosphere is saturated with divine energy. That's how you regulate things in the realm of the Spirit. It makes no difference what happens in the world or the diseases that afflict others—you remain unmoved. You're strengthened and energised by the Spirit, filled with divine might to dominate the forces of darkness and tame circumstances.

LET'S TALK



A certain sculptor sat before a massive block of marble. He didn't rush to strike it with his chisel. Instead, he spent hours sketching, envisioning, and aligning his mind with the form he intended to reveal. Only then did he begin to work.

Prayer is much like that. Many approach God's throne hastily, with unformed words and scattered thoughts, hoping that sheer length or repetition will suffice. But the Lord Jesus taught us in Matthew 6:7 not to pray "vain repetitions, as the heathen do: for they think that they shall be heard for their much speaking." True prayer is not careless utterance; it is a spiritual alignment, a purposeful engagement with the Father.

When you plan your prayer, you bring order to your fellowship. You're not reducing the time spent with God—you're elevating it. By taking a moment to write down the matters of your heart—your desires, the areas where you need His guidance, and even the thoughts He has already impressed upon you—you position yourself to pray with clarity and faith.

Then, as you yield to the Spirit in tongues, you transcend human vocabulary. You speak mysteries, articulating divine secrets that only heaven can decode.

It'll help to always take a moment to write down the things you want to talk to the Lord about. Think about the areas of your life where you desire His guidance, intervention and blessings. Also, consider the thoughts and insights He might have already stirred in your heart. Then, you speak in tongues. Through speaking in tongues, you articulate divine mysteries and gain insight into realities beyond human comprehension.

LET'S TALK



Praying in the Spirit is not a casual exercise; it is a vital spiritual practice that sustains and strengthens you. God designed prayer—especially praying in tongues—as a divine means of keeping your spirit healthy, vibrant, and strong. When you pray in tongues, you edify yourself. It's like charging a battery until it is full. Your spirit is energised, fortified, and refreshed, enabling you to function effectively in the things of God. No wonder Paul declared in Romans 1:9 NKJV, *"For God is my witness, whom I serve with my spirit in the gospel of His Son..."* We serve God with our spirit, and for that spirit to remain effective, it must continually be built up.

The Bible shows us that the human spirit can either be weak or strong. To strengthen your spirit, you must give yourself to praying in the Holy Ghost. As you do, you rise higher and higher like an edifice, strong and unshakeable. Paul understood this deeply. He prayed that the Ephesian church be strengthened with might through God's Spirit in their inner man (Ephesians 3:16). The word "might" here refers to miracle-working ability infused into your spirit by the Holy Ghost. That was Paul's secret to his continuous growth, victories, and extraordinary accomplishments. He could boldly say, *"I thank my God I speak with tongues more*

than you all" (1 Corinthians 14:18 NKJV).

Paul's consistency in praying in tongues was key to his continuous progress, victories and extraordinary accomplishments. It wasn't something he did occasionally; it was a lifestyle. If you desire consistent growth, success, and advancement, then praying in the Spirit must be something you do consistently. It'll help you make consistent progress as you experience continuous increase in grace and victory after victory. Hallelujah!

"When the clouds are full of water, it rains...."

LET'S TALK



Farmers know the quiet patience of waiting for rain. They till the soil, plant their seeds, and look to the sky. Days may pass with no sign of water, yet they keep tending the ground because they understand a truth written into creation: when the clouds are full, they will pour themselves upon the earth (Ecclesiastes 11:3).

Prayer works in much the same way. Some requests are answered swiftly, but other kinds of prayer must be heaped upon one another, built up day after day, until the "cloud" is heavy enough to release its blessing. Every day, you add some more. And then, you add some more, and some more, until you reach the climax where the results burst forth like a gusher, blowing the lid open.

We often grow impatient, wondering why answers seem delayed. But just as a farmer cannot rush the clouds, neither can we rush the Spirit's timing. Our role is to persevere, to pray without ceasing (1 Thessalonians 5:17), trusting that no prayer is wasted. Sometimes, the Spirit of God can lead you to fast for a certain number of days because He wants you to keep filling up your cloud. It's not so much about staying away from food; that's not what He's getting at. Rather, it's about focusing your attention on the Spirit and having the kind of meditation and prayer that conditions your spirit for the work He wants to do in

you, for you or through you.

And when the cloud finally bursts, it is rarely a trickle. It comes as a gusher—answers overflowing. Yet even then, prayer does not end. For new clouds are always forming, and new rain is always needed. So, lift your eyes to heaven. Keep adding your prayers, your worship, and your intercession. The clouds are filling. And when they're full, they'll empty themselves upon your life in abundance, in God's perfect time.

"For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God."

LET'S TALK ►

Sarah woke troubled. In her dream the night before, she saw herself losing her job, and all day she couldn't shake the fear. She spoke nervously to her friends, made decisions out of anxiety, and carried a heaviness in her heart—all because of a dream.

But Scripture invites us to see dreams differently. Through the prophet Jeremiah, God draws a sharp line: "The prophet who has a dream, let him tell a dream; and he who has My word, let him speak My word faithfully. What is the chaff to the wheat?" says the Lord." (Jeremiah 23:28 NKJV).

Dreams, Jeremiah says, are like chaff—the husks that blow away in the wind when wheat is threshed. They may seem impressive, even alarming, but they have no weight, no substance. The Word of God, however, is wheat: nourishing, grounding, life-giving.

In the Old Testament, God sometimes used dreams to guide His people. But with the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, a greater way was given. Now God speaks by His Spirit and through His Word, not through dreams that confuse or mislead.

That means Christians are not to be guided by what they see in the night but by the eternal Word that never

changes. To live by dreams is to cling to chaff; to live by the Spirit and the Word is to hold the grain that feeds and sustains.

So if fear rises from a dream, discard it. If a vision in the night troubles you, release it to the wind. Anchor yourself instead in what is sure: "...*The word of the Lord endures forever...*" (1 Peter 1:25 NKJV).

"To know the love of Christ which passes knowledge; that you may be filled with all the fullness of God."

LET'S TALK



To be filled with the fullness of God is to carry within you the very essence of divinity—the totality of His being, His wisdom, and His glory. This is not a promise reserved for heaven; it is the present reality of every child of God. In Christ, you are replete with God.

The Scripture uses the Greek word "Plêroō" to describe this fullness. It conveys the idea of a vessel bearing the maximum load, full and running over. That is who you are: completely inundated with the divine nature. There is no room for fear or weakness; you are full of God.

The Lord Jesus lived in this consciousness. He declared, *"...For as the Father has life in Himself, so He has granted the Son to have life in Himself"* (John 5:26 NKJV). The same life of the Father flowed through Him in its fullness. Now, that same life has been imparted to you.

God's plan is for the Church to walk in this very consciousness—fully awakened to our divine origin and expression. At the rapture, He will present to Himself a glorious Church, not one escaping the world in fear, but one triumphant, radiant with His glory, and mature in the expression of His divine life.

Therefore, refuse to think small or live as though

you are ordinary. You are the dwelling place of the Almighty, the visible expression of His invisible presence. Carry this awareness everywhere you go. Let the fullness of God in you find expression in your words, your decisions, and your conduct.

"Till we all come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a perfect man, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ."

LET'S TALK



In our previous study, we saw that in Christ we are filled with all the fullness of God. From the very moment of the new birth, the totality of His divine nature was imparted to us. We are complete in Him, replete with His life, wisdom, and glory.

However, just as a newborn child is fully human at birth but must grow to maturity, so also the child of God must grow spiritually. Spiritual growth enables you to manifest the fullness of the God-life in you. The more spiritually mature you are, the more effectively you can fulfil God's plan for your life. This is where many miss it. They wonder why certain results seem inconsistent in their lives. The answer is maturity. Some manifestations of the Spirit may occur occasionally, but for them to be sustained, spiritual growth is required.

The Word admonishes us: "...grow up in all things into Him who is the head—Christ" (Ephesians 4:15). Growth comes as you feed diligently on the Word, pray consistently, and fellowship with the Holy Spirit. Peter exhorts us, "As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby" (1 Peter 2:2 KJV). Whilst this is accurate, growth is not by hearing only, but by doing the Word. James

1:22 says, *"But be doers of the word, and not hearers only..."*
It is the Word you practise that abides in you and produces lasting transformation.

Therefore, recognise that you are already full of God. Now, give yourself to the Word and prayer so that His fullness in you may find full expression, bringing glory to His Name and producing enduring fruits for the Kingdom.
