SUNDAY 1

SENT AS A WITNESS



There was a man sent from God, whose name was John (John 1:6).

Some people argue that no one should say, “God sent me,” but the Scripture already settles that. The Lord Jesus said in John 20:21, “**...as my Father hath sent me, even so send I you.**” Moreover, we read in our opening scripture that there was a man sent from God whose name was John. So, like John, you’re God-sent. You’ve been sent as a witness with the power of the Holy Spirit.

You’re not a wanderer in life; you’re a divine envoy. You’re heaven’s ambassador in the earth: “**Now then we are ambassadors for Christ...**” (2 Corinthians 5:20). You’re a light bearer, and more than that, you’re light: “**Ye are the light of the world...**” (Matthew 5:14). You’ve been sent to illuminate men’s path and light up the nations with the message of Christ’s salvation.

Refuse to let anyone convince you otherwise; you were born with a purpose. You came as a witness to your generation. Your life is God’s message. And being a witness means making disciples. The Master’s instruction wasn’t to simply lead men to Christ but to also make disciples of

them: ***“Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age” (Matthew 28:19-20 NIV).***

That means those you reach with the Gospel are to follow and observe your faith. They should walk in your steps in doctrine, in prayer, and in Kingdom service. They’re to follow the vision you’re following. The Apostle Paul understood this when he said, ***“Be ye followers of me, even as I also am of Christ”*** (1 Corinthians 11:1). True disciples lead others in the path they themselves are walking. Disciples make disciples. So, stay committed and be consistent in soul winning. Be bold about your calling and faithful to your divine mission.

Dear Father, thank you for choosing and sending me as your witness to my generation. I walk in the light of your Word and reflect your glory everywhere. MONDAY 2

THE OUTWORKING OF THE WORD IN YOU



To whom God would make known what is the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles; which is Christ in you, the hope of glory (Colossians 1:27).

T rue Christianity is the outworking of the Word in you. When you talk, it's the Word; when you act, it's the Word. The Christian, essentially, is the expression or the image of the Word, such that every step you take and all the things you do are the outworkings of the Word of God.

That's what the Lord Jesus was when He walked the earth; He was the unveiling of the Word: ***“And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us...”*** (John 1:14). He was the manifestation of God, the express image of His person. Thus, your life is the revelation of the Word because you've been born of the same Word: ***“Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever”*** (1 Peter 1:23).

2 Corinthians 3:2-3 says that you've been manifestly declared to be the epistle of Christ: ***“Forasmuch as ye***

are manifestly declared to be the epistle of Christ ministered by us, written not with ink, but with the Spirit of the living God; not in tables of stone, but in fleshy tables of the heart.” The epistle of Christ is the Word of Christ.

No wonder we’re the effulgence of His glory, the manifestation of His righteousness. When you show up, Christ shows up. As He is, so are you in this world (1 John 4:17). You make manifest the savour of His knowledge, wisdom, grace and power in every place (2 Corinthians 2:14). Blessed Be God! You’re Christ alive in your world today. He manifests His love, power, compassion, and grace to the world through you. Have this consciousness.

PRAYER

Dear Father, I thank you for making me your living epistle, known and read by all men. My life is the expression of the glory of Christ. The divine life is manifested through me, and I bring others into this life through the Gospel. Your knowledge, grace, power, wisdom and righteousness are unveiled in, and through me, in Jesus’ Name. Amen.

TUESDAY 3

GOD'S ALWAYS WATCHING



Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap (Galatians 6:7).

When you study the Scriptures carefully, you'll notice a striking pattern with certain individuals who lost their place with God and why it happened. Take Cain, the firstborn of Adam, as an example; he had hatred in his heart against his brother Abel.

The Bible tells us that Abel's works were righteous, but Cain's weren't. Instead of correcting himself, Cain allowed hatred to consume him, and he murdered his brother. He lost his place because of the evil in his heart. Also, consider Esau; for just one meal, he sold his birthright.

The Bible describes Esau as profane because spiritual things meant nothing to him. He treated the birthright casually; to him, it was intangible, so he thought it could be tossed aside in exchange for food. But God looks at the heart; He saw that Esau was profane. He wasn't profane because he sold his birthright; he sold his birthright because he was profane.

Later on, when it was time to receive the blessing, which was tied to the birthright, he lost it despite seeking it with tears (read Hebrews 12:16-17). The lesson here is very clear: you may deceive men, but you can't deceive God. He weighs the motives of the heart.

Therefore, position your heart rightly because your blessing, your promotion, your place in God's plan are tied to how you revere or hallow spiritual realities. Don't trade your divine inheritance for worldly pursuits.

PRAYER

Dear Father, thank you for granting me understanding through your Word. My heart is rightly positioned to value spiritual things and walk uprightly in reverence for you and your Word, conscious that my inheritance in Christ is precious and eternal. My heart is stayed on you and the eternal reward of my works of righteousness, in Jesus' Name. Amen.

WEDNESDAY 4

WE DON'T CLAP TO PRAISE GOD



Let my prayer be set forth before thee as incense; and the lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice (Psalm 141:2).

It's important to understand the spirituality of ministry and the place of music and expressions of worship in the house of God. Clapping, for instance, which many are very used to in church, is neither praise nor worship. While clapping is not wrong, it must be put in its proper place.

Clapping is applause; it's a sign of approval or excitement. Spiritually, however, it doesn't equate to praising or worshipping God. You've probably heard people say, "Let's clap for Jesus." But clapping is not how the Bible teaches us to worship or praise the Lord.

True worship is expressed with words, songs of the Spirit, and the lifting of our hands in reverence to God. For example, we saw from our opening scripture that the lifting of hands is an act of worship recognized in heaven. The New Testament praise and worship is in spirit and truth, as Jesus said the Father desires (John 4:23-24).

When a miracle happens and people clap, they're not praising God; they're expressing approval or excitement.

The danger is that in doing so, they sometimes neglect to give God the actual worship He deserves as a result of such a miracle. This is why we must be instructed by the Word. Worship must always be rooted in knowledge, not habit.

So, while clapping has its place as a human response to events, true praise and worship must come from your spirit, expressed through your words, songs, the lifting of your hands, and other expressions in worship that the Bible talks about. This is what glorifies the Lord. We may clap in celebration of victories, but that's not praise: ***"O clap your hands, all ye people; shout unto God with the voice of triumph"*** (Psalm 47:1).

PRAYER

Dear Father, thank you for the understanding of true worship and the revelation that we are the true circumcision that worship you in the Spirit, rejoice in Christ Jesus and have no confidence in the flesh. Even now, I worship you from the bottom of my heart, for you're the only true God, righteous, holy, just, gracious, pure and kind. Thank you for your glory in my life, in Jesus' Name. Amen.

THURSDAY 5

DON'T SPEAK AGAINST GOD



Your words have been stout against me, saith the LORD. Yet ye say, What have we spoken so much against thee? (Malachi 3:13).

From our opening scripture above, we read something quite sobering. Speaking through the Prophet Malachi, God said, “Your words have been stout against me.” Imagine that men would speak words that stand against God. Yet, in their ignorance, they asked, “What have we spoken against you?” They didn’t even realize they were speaking in defiance to God. This is still happening today.

Many take sides against God with their words without knowing it. They say things that negate what He has said concerning them. Even in simple things, for example, where God has said divine health is your heritage in Christ, yet many talk sickness all the time. That’s speaking against truth; and God’s Word is truth (John 17:17).

The Word says, “...**All things are yours**” (1 Corinthians 3:21); therefore, don't say, "I'm broke." Declare that you have all the resources you require for all that God wants you to do. The Bible shows us that life and death are

in the power of the tongue (Proverbs 18:21). Your words aren't empty; when they align with God's Word, His truth and the reality of what it says are established in your life.

But when your words contradict the Word, you create a loophole for the adversary. God has said, ***"...I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee. So that we may boldly say, The Lord is my helper, and I will not fear..."*** (Hebrews 13:5-6). Notice the sequence: "He said, so you may boldly say"; that's the principle. He wants your words to be in sync with His.

This is how it works in the Kingdom. If you're new to this, it may sound unusual at first, but it's the life of faith. Don't side against God. Don't nullify His blessings in your life with wrong confessions. Say what He has said. Declare what He has declared. That's how to walk in victory!

PRAYER

Dear Father, thank you for opening my understanding to the power of words. I boldly declare that I'm full of health, strength, prosperity, and I walk in victory. I speak in line with your truth always, affirming your truths as my reality. I live above circumstances, functioning in the blessings of Christ, in Jesus' Name. Amen.

FRIDAY 6

RIGHTEOUSNESS CONSCIOUSNESS



For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him (2 Corinthians 5:21).

The Apostle Paul, by the Spirit, unveils one of the most extraordinary revelations in Scripture: God made Jesus, who knew no sin, to be sin for us so that we might be made the righteousness of God in Him. Remarkable! Jesus wasn't made a sin offering or a sin sacrifice in a figurative sense; rather, He was made sin itself. On the cross, He became the very embodiment of sin.

This is much more than He being declared sinless by God; it conveys something deeper: Jesus had a consciousness of His own sinlessness. He was sinlessness-conscious. He lived with the awareness that there was no trace of sin in Him.

This is why righteousness consciousness is so vital. If the Lord Jesus lived with a consciousness of His sinlessness, then as His righteousness, you must live with a consciousness of your righteousness in Him. He didn't just make you righteous, He made you the righteousness of God. You've become the very expression of God's

righteousness. You're His righteousness, walking and talking, in human flesh.

When you understand this, it changes the way you live. You'll no longer see yourself as a forgiven sinner but as a bona fide child of God living out His perfection, His purity and His glory in this world. This is more than a legal standing; it's your vital reality. He said in Isaiah 54:17, ***"... their righteousness is of me..."***

No wonder Paul said in Philippians 3:8-9, ***"...that I may win Christ, And be found in him, not having mine own righteousness, which is of the law, but that which is through the faith of Christ, the righteousness which is of God by faith."*** Be ever conscious of your righteousness in Him. That consciousness gives you boldness in life and dominion over adversities.

PRAYER

Dear Father, I thank you for the revelation of my righteousness in Christ. I live every day with the consciousness that I'm your righteousness, holy, blameless and justified. I walk in dominion, manifesting your nature and fulfilling your perfect will for my life, in Jesus' Name. Amen.

SATURDAY 7

THE EXPRESSION AND EMBODIMENT OF DIVINITY



For it pleased the Father that in him should all fulness dwell (Colossians 1:19).

The Lord Jesus is much more than a great or highly honoured religious leader; He's the totality of divinity in flesh. He's the embodiment of Deity. Titus 2:13 describes Him as "the great God": ***"Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ."***

He's also the totality of all wisdom and knowledge: Colossians 2:3, ***"In whom are hid all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge."*** Hallelujah! When He walked the streets of Galilee, Nazareth, and Jerusalem, that was Wisdom walking; that was Wisdom personified; God in the flesh was taking His steps upon the earth.

When this understanding dawns on your spirit, you'll know what it truly means to be identified with the Lord Jesus and to pray in His Name. His Name has all authority in heaven, in earth, and under the earth. And in the Book of Revelation, the Bible tells us something staggering; when the Apostle John saw the great throne of Almighty God, the One seated upon it was the Lord Jesus. That tells you

who He really is.

In the Old Testament, God revealed Himself to Israel through different names: Jehovah Rapha (the Lord my healer), Jehovah Tsidkenu (the Lord my righteousness), Jehovah Shalom (the Lord my peace), and so on. But the Bible says He has magnified His Word above His name (Psalm 138:2). Who's the Word? Jesus Christ; He's the Word made flesh.

Now the Bible says, ***"...at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father"*** (Philippians 2:10-11). To know Him is to love Him, for He is the very expression of God's person, glory, righteousness and love. Blessed be God!

PRAYER

Lord Jesus, I worship and adore you; you're the greatest, the all-powerful and sovereign Lord of heaven and earth. You're the great God of glory, saviour of the world, the King of righteousness and eternity. You're gracious, glorious, ever-loving, faithful, true, and forever just. I live triumphantly in your Name, for you're my life, my light and my all. Amen.

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a dedicated nation, [God's] own purchased, special people, that you may set forth the wonderful deeds and display the virtues and perfections of Him Who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light (1 Peter 2:9 AMPC).

As a Christian, you're not subject to disease, infirmities or demons, because you have the transcendent life in Christ. You're not in bondage to the elements of this world; you live above them. I love the way the Apostle Peter puts it; he said, ***“Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust”*** (2 Peter 1:4).

You live far above and beyond the corruption, decadence and darkness of this world because you're an associate of the God-kind, a partaker of the divine nature. You're superior to Satan and the corrupting influences of this present world of darkness. Your life is full of blessings, glory and virtue. Virtue is excellence; you have an excellent life in Christ Jesus.

Think about the Apostle Peter who wrote the beautiful verses of scripture that we read earlier; he once trembled with fear and denied the Lord Jesus before a little girl. His faith was unstable. But after he received the Holy Spirit, something changed. He expressed and manifested the God-life in Him with such glory and boldness that through his preaching, three thousand souls gave their hearts to Christ in one day, as revealed in Acts 2:41.

What transformed him? He had come to the revelation of the glorious life we have in Christ. What a life! There's no failure, defeat, or darkness in you; only blessings, excellence, perfection, and glory. 1 Peter 3:9 says you were called to inherit a blessing, not shame or weakness. This is the life you've received in Christ; it's one of dominion over sickness, disease, demons, poverty, failure and death. Glory to God!

PRAYER

I thank you Father for the glorious life you've given me in Christ Jesus, a life of blessings, excellence, health, victory and strength. I walk in your marvellous light, displaying your virtues and perfections to my world. I live above sickness, defeat and demonic influence because I live in Christ. Hallelujah!

MONDAY 9

THE CHRISTIAN CAN'T BE CURSED



Not rendering evil for evil, or railing for railing: but contrariwise blessing; knowing that ye are thereunto called, that ye should inherit a blessing (1 Peter 3:9).

Some people gripe about the circumstances of their lives, thinking the reason things aren't working out is that they're perhaps under a curse. But if you're a Christian, the Word of God is clear: you can't be cursed. No family curse, ancestral curse, or a curse from the enemy can work against you. Only blessings are permitted to work and prevail in your life.

Ponder again what we read in our opening scripture: you were called to inherit a blessing. Moreover, the Bible says, **"...If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature..."** (2 Corinthians 5:17). You're a new creature, superior to Satan and all his works. Therefore, it makes no difference that you were threatened by a witch doctor or voodoo priest; there's no enchantment or divination that can work against you, for the Bible says, **"Surely there is no enchantment against Jacob, neither is there any divination against Israel..."** (Numbers 23:23).

Understand this: truth unknown is powerless, but truth known puts you over. If you don't know what God has said about you, you could walk in fear and bondage. But the accurate knowledge of the Word makes you free: **"And**

ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free” (John 8:32).

You don’t need anyone to “lift” a curse off you. Christ already blessed you, and in Him, you’ve been born anew and into the glorious liberty of the sons of God; you’re free forever! Think about it: if you were cursed, who would enforce it? The devil? You have more power than he and all his demons put together.

How about God? He would never supervise a curse against His own children. The only Christian who can live as though under a curse is the one who ignores or disdains the Word of God. To neglect, reject, or despise the Word is to step out from the covering of divine truth, and that, in itself, becomes a curse for, the Bible says, ***“Whoso despiseth the word shall be destroyed...”*** (Proverbs 13:13).

But as long as you’re in Christ, yielded to His Word and guided by the Spirit, you’re untouchable and walk in blessings only. You live in victory and walk in the boldness of your inheritance in Christ, blessed and empowered to reign. Glory to God!

PRAYER

Dear Father, thank you for the life of blessing you’ve given me in Christ. I live far above the influence of darkness, walking in the liberty of your Word. I walk in victory and in the dominion of my righteousness in Christ, blessed and empowered to reign, in Jesus’ Name. Amen.

TUESDAY 10

THE CONSCIOUSNESS OF HIS LORDSHIP



And now, brethren, I commend you to God, and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up, and to give you an inheritance among all them which are sanctified (Acts 20:32).

Now that you're in Christ, it's a new life altogether, a life under the lordship of Jesus. Yet, many Christians are not fully conscious of His lordship in their everyday life. When you say Jesus Christ is Lord of your life, it means that His Word has become the supreme authority in your life.

The lordship of Christ is expressed first in the lordship of His Word. You cannot function in His lordship without submitting to the authority of His Word. That Word is described in Scripture as "the Word of His grace"; that's what builds you up in life, strengthens you, and establishes you in the inheritance that belongs to you in Christ.

This is why you can't afford to be in just any place, listening to just anything. The Word of His grace reveals Christ, unveils His finished work, and imparts faith,

boldness and the consciousness of your inheritance. That's what empowers you to function effectively in the lordship of Jesus.

So, make up your mind to live perpetually under the authority of the Word. The more you submit to the Word, the more you'll function in the consciousness of His lordship for His glory to be revealed in your life in ever-increasing measure.

CONFESSION

I'm fully yielded to the authority of God's Word, the Word of His grace that builds me, strengthens me, and positions me in my inheritance in Christ. I'm growing, making progress, and manifesting the glory of God in ever-increasing measure because I'm a doer of the Word. The Word of God is my life and my all. Hallelujah!

WEDNESDAY 11

APPLY FAITH WITH KNOWLEDGE



My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge: because thou hast rejected knowledge, I will also reject thee... (Hosea 4:6).

Observe the words of the prophet in our theme scripture; God didn't say His people perish for the lack of faith but for the lack of knowledge. You can have all the faith in the world and still be defeated if your faith is applied in ignorance. Faith without knowledge is misdirected; it becomes unproductive. This is why the knowledge of God's Word is so vital.

Consider the temptation of the Lord Jesus in the wilderness immediately after His baptism. Just before then, the Bible says, "***And the Holy Ghost descended in a bodily shape like a dove upon him, and a voice came from heaven, which said, Thou art my beloved Son; in thee I am well pleased***" (Luke 3:22).

But Satan, right afterwards, tempted Him, saying, "***...If thou be the Son of God, command that these stones be made bread***" (Matthew 4:3). The Lord Jesus had faith; He could have commanded the stones to become bread. But He applied knowledge. He understood that the voice behind the instruction wasn't from God but from Satan. Therefore, He answered with the Word: "***...It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word***

that proceedeth out of the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4).

Again, Satan tempted Him, urging Him to jump off the pinnacle of the temple because "it is written" that angels would bear Him up. He misquoted scripture, but the Master, once again, knew the Word and recognized the misuse of scripture and replied, ***"...It is written again, Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God"*** (Matthew 4:7).

This is why you must never walk in ignorance. You can't walk with God without His light, and His light is His Word. Psalm 119:105 tells us, ***"Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path."*** Knowledge gives your faith direction, stability and effectiveness.

Without knowledge, even strong faith can be misapplied and lead to error. But with knowledge, you walk in dominion, victory and truth. Remember what the Apostle Peter, in his second epistle, said, ***"And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge"*** (2 Peter 1:5). Always apply your faith with knowledge.

PRAYER

Dear Father, thank you for the knowledge of your Word that fills my spirit and guides my faith. I refuse to walk in ignorance or be misled by the deceptions of the enemy. Through your Word, my faith is rightly directed, effectual and changing hopeless situations, in Jesus' Name. Amen.

THURSDAY 12

TRUE SUBMISSION TO THE LORDSHIP OF JESUS



Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you (James 4:7).

Some situations and challenges you face may not change until you understand true submission to the lordship of the Name of Jesus. It's a missing link in the lives of some Christians. They say, "I've prayed and fasted, but the power of God in my life seems elusive. What more do I need to do?" I'll give you an example in Matthew 17.

The Bible tells us how a man approached the Lord Jesus, kneeling before Him, and pleading for his son who was tormented by a demon (Matthew 17:14-16). The Lord responded with these words: ***"...O faithless and perverse generation, how long shall I be with you? How long shall I bear with you? Bring him here to Me. And Jesus rebuked the demon, and it came out of him; and the child was cured from that very hour"*** (Matthew 17:17-18 NKJV).

The disciples had been given authority to cast out demons and heal the sick (Matthew 10:1), which made their inability to cast out the demon from the boy perplexing to them. After witnessing how Jesus successfully cast out

the demon, in their frustration, they asked Him privately why they couldn't do it themselves.

Then the Master explained, ***“...Because of your unbelief: for verily I say unto you, If ye have faith as a grain of mustard seed, ye shall say unto this mountain, Remove hence to yonder place; and it shall remove; and nothing shall be impossible unto you. Howbeit this kind goeth not out but by prayer and fasting”*** (Matthew 17:20-21). Notice His words; they reveal something important about the essence of true prayer and fasting.

Sadly, this is where many people miss it; they fast for more power to cast out devils, but that's not the idea here. One of the things that prayer and fasting does for you is to get you more submissive to the lordship of Jesus. The more you yield yourself to Him, the more His power flows through you.

PRAYER

Dear Father, I thank you for the revelation of your Word. I submit myself wholly to your lordship, acknowledging that you are my sufficiency and strength. Your power and grace flow through me unhindered to heal the sick, cast out devils, raise the dead, and do mighty works with the Gospel, in the Name of the Lord Jesus. Amen.

FRIDAY 13

BEWARE OF UNSCRIPTURAL ORDINANCES



Wherefore if ye be dead with Christ from the rudiments of the world, why, as though living in the world, are ye subject to ordinances (Colossians 2:20).

There're those in the Church today who, prior to being born again, were exposed to occult practices, idol worship, and rituals. Sadly, because some of them haven't been properly taught the Word of God, such practices from their background have continued to affect their Christian life. Many of them still believe in and use material mediums like oil, handkerchiefs, mantles, charms, "holy water," and other objects for spiritual power or contact.

In time, some of these people rose to become pastors and leaders of churches and introduced those same practices into the body of Christ. They made God's people dependent on material things for their faith, saying, "Carry this, drink this, and bathe with this." But the Bible doesn't teach this. Christianity is not about objects; it's a relationship with the living God through Jesus Christ.

The same thing happened with music and worship. Some introduced dances from idol worship into the Church,

dances that were once offered to demons. But thank God all that is changing now through the right teaching of God's Word on true worship. Real spiritual worship is not fleshly excitement and entertainment but a spiritual sacrifice offered through the Spirit.

True worship is not about physical objects or carnal displays; it is the outflow of your heart to God, inspired by the Holy Ghost. You don't need holy water, oil, or any other physical medium to connect with God. He lives in you by His Spirit.

So, stay in the Word. Your words of faith, the lifting of your hands, your songs of praise from the heart, according to His Word, are what minister to Him. Refuse to be carried away by unscriptural traditions of men that make the Word of God of none effect.

PRAYER

Dear Father, I worship you from my heart, in spirit and in truth. I refuse to be subject to the senses, for my faith is anchored in your Word. Thank you for the privilege of being your dwelling place and for the fellowship of the Holy Spirit who guides me always in truth, in Jesus' Name. Amen.

KNOWLEDGE THAT EDIFIES



And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge (2 Peter 1:5).

The increased knowledge of God's Word is so important for your consistent growth, progress, productivity and effectiveness in life. That's why the Spirit, through the Apostle Peter, tells us to add knowledge to faith and virtue.

Interestingly, the word translated "knowledge" in the verse above is the Greek word "gnōsis," which refers to scientific or general knowledge gained through study and information. This is not revelation knowledge but information you gather by reading, studying and learning.

So, in essence, the Lord is saying don't be ignorant. Open your mind and be versatile. Learn a little more about everything. Some people know nothing beyond what they studied in school for exams, and they remain mentally stagnant. That's not God's plan for you. He wants you to be studious and increasingly knowledgeable. Knowledge empowers. Knowledge gives you an advantage.

So, decide you're going to be deliberate in studying

the Word, not an accidental glance once in a while. Set your targets; make it a lifestyle. Build your mind with useful information. Expand your horizon. This doesn't mean keeping up with the news and saturating your life with the lies, deceit and fear peddled by the world's media. Rather, fill your heart and your mind with knowledge that edifies and strengthens your faith. That's the kind of knowledge to add to your life.

PRAYER

Dear Father, thank you for the knowledge of your Word that fills my heart and by which I live triumphantly every day. Thank you for your grace and peace that are multiplied in my life as I study and meditate on your Word, causing me to be increasingly fruitful, productive and effective in life and ministry, in Jesus' Name. Amen.

SUNDAY 15

WALKING IN THE TRUTH



I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth (3 John 1:4).

Truth was a central theme in the writings of the Apostle John. In his first epistle alone, he used the word truth at least ten times, an indication of its importance. In his third epistle, he expressed his delight when the brethren testified of others walking in the truth. He declared, “I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth.” That’s remarkable!

Why was truth so important to John? It’s because the Lord Jesus Himself is the embodiment of truth. God’s Word is truth (John 17:17). John 1:14 says, “***And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.***” Then the 17th verse says, “***For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ.***”

No wonder the Master said in John 14:6, “***...I am the way, the truth, and the life....***” Truth is not merely a set of principles or abstract ideas; it’s a person, Christ Jesus. To walk in truth, therefore, is to walk in Him and live by His Word. Even in worship, truth is indispensable. John

4:23-24 says, ***“But the hour cometh, and now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth: for the Father seeketh such to worship him. God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth.”***

The Father seeks worshippers whose lives align with truth. And to make this possible, He gave us the Holy Spirit, who is the Spirit of truth: ***“Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth...”*** (John 16:13). You’ll never be deceived or walk in error if you yield to Him. He takes the things of Christ, because Christ is the truth, and reveals them to you (John 16:14).

So, walking in truth is much more than just living honestly; it’s living in alignment with Christ, His Word, and the guidance of the Spirit of truth. And we walk in truth because we’re of the truth. Hallelujah!

PRAYER

Dear Father, thank you for the blessedness of knowing and walking in the truth. Thank you for the Spirit of truth who guides me daily in your perfect will, to walk therein and fulfil your purpose in the earth. My life is for your glory, today and always, in Jesus’ Name. Amen.

TRUTH IS THE WORD OF GOD



Sanctify them through thy truth: thy word is truth (John 17:17).

The world doesn't know what truth is. In fact, when Jesus stood before Pilate and declared that He came to bear witness to the truth, Pilate was confused and asked, "What is truth?" (John 18:38). But the Lord Jesus already gave the answer; truth is the Word of God. To live in the truth, therefore, is to live in the Word just as walking in the truth is walking in the Word.

That's why you must open yourself to the ministry of the Holy Spirit to teach you God's truths. He's the Spirit of truth sent by the Father to guide you into all truth (John 16:13). He unveils the truth about life, about God, about the Kingdom, and about you. He unveils the realities of life to you, and truth is reality.

Facts may change, but truth is eternal. And the key to becoming truth-conscious is meditating on the Word. As you meditate on the Word, your spirit is trained and filled with truth, making it a trustworthy guide. The Word you've deposited into your spirit becomes readily available, always

present, always alive and ready to rise to the surface whenever you need it.

Therefore, live in the truth by living the Word. Living the Word is doing the Word. We're Word practitioners, and that's where the blessing is: ***“But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves... But whoso looketh into the perfect law of liberty, and continueth therein, he being not a forgetful hearer, but a doer of the work, this man shall be blessed in his deed”*** (James 1:22-25).

CONFESSION

I live in the truth, walk in the truth, and meditate daily on the truth—God's Word. And by the Spirit of truth, I'm guided in God's perfect will for my life, manifesting fruits and works of righteousness as I live in the consciousness of my heritage, blessings and divine realities in Christ Jesus. Amen.

THE WORD EXPRESSED IN YOU



But have renounced the hidden things of dishonesty, not walking in craftiness, nor handling the word of God deceitfully; but by manifestation of the truth commending ourselves to every man's conscience in the sight of God (2 Corinthians 4:2).

There's a difference between telling the truth and the manifestation of the truth. Our opening scripture isn't talking about merely being truthful about a matter or subject; rather, it's about living the Word, for the Word is truth (John 17:17).

The manifestation of truth, therefore, is the manifestation of the Word, the Word expressed in and through you. It's when your life becomes a living Bible, so much so that others can literally read the Word of God in you. That's Christianity! It's life in the Word, by the Word and through the Word.

We're the offspring of the Word. 1 Peter 1:23 says, ***"Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever."*** You're born of the Word and therefore are called to express the Word. Your life is the unveiling of the Word of God. James 1:18 says, ***"Of his own will***

begat he us with the word of truth, that we should be a kind of firstfruits of his creatures.”

This should further help you understand why the Spirit, through the Apostle Paul, declares that we’re the epistles of Christ: ***“Forasmuch as ye are manifestly declared to be the epistle of Christ ministered by us, written not with ink, but with the Spirit of the living God; not in tables of stone, but in fleshy tables of the heart”*** (2 Corinthians 3:3).

Every step the Lord Jesus took when He walked the earth was the Word of God in action. He’s the living, active, incarnate Word: ***“And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us...”*** (John 1:14). 1 John 4:17 says, ***“...as he is, so are we in this world.”*** You’re the Word alive today, walking, talking and blessing lives. Have this consciousness. Live the life God has called you to live: the manifestation of the truth.

PRAYER

Dear Father, I thank you that your Word lives in me and is expressed through me. My life is a manifestation of truth, a living epistle read by men. I walk in the consciousness that I am the Word alive today, bringing blessing, illumination and righteousness to all in my world, in Jesus’ Name. Amen.

WEDNESDAY 18

STICK TO THE WORD



...yea, let God be true, but every man a liar... (Romans 3:4).

God's Word never fails; it is truth and produces what it talks about. Titus 1:2 tells us that God cannot lie. It brings to mind an encounter I had with a blind man many years ago in one of our meetings. After praying for him, the Lord told me he had been healed. So I approached him and asked, "Sir, can you see me?" He said, "No." His eyes were completely shut, and the crowd began to laugh.

Nevertheless, I stood firm on what the Lord had told me and declared before everyone, "God said this man has been healed, and God cannot lie." Though the man insisted he couldn't see, I remained unruffled. And after a few minutes, his eyes opened, and he began to rejoice that he could see. If I hadn't acted on the truth of God's Word, he might have gone back home blind. Stick to the Word, and you'd surely have a testimony.

On another occasion, the Lord showed me a striking vision. He put a man before me and said, "This man was diagnosed with cancer, but look at him, there's no cancer in his body." And indeed, when I looked, there was no cancer. Then the Lord said, "But he will die of cancer." Shocked, I

asked, “Why will he die if there’s no cancer?”

And the Lord replied, “Because he believes the report he was given.” That’s the difference between facts and truth. Human diagnosis may present a fact, but God’s Word reveals the truth. The man would die, not because there was cancer in him, but because he chose to believe the wrong report, and his faith in that report created the cancer.

Many Christians struggle with flaws simply because they believe in them rather than see themselves from the standpoint of God’s Word. As long as you keep saying, “I have this weakness, I have this flaw,” you’ll live in that struggle. But when you believe and declare God’s Word, and see yourself the way He sees you in the Word, you’ll live triumphantly every day. Your life blossoms from glory to glory when you stick to the Word, speaking and living accordingly.

PRAYER

Dear Father, thank you for bringing me into perfection in Christ Jesus. My words are consistent with your truth, and I walk in the consciousness of who I am in Christ. I live beyond human limitations, manifesting your glory and righteousness. My life glows from glory to glory because I live in and by your Word, in Jesus’ Name. Amen.

THURSDAY 19

A LIFE GIVER—RADIANT, LAMBENT AND DIVINE



And so it is written, The first man Adam was made a living soul; the last Adam was made a quickening spirit (1 Corinthians 15:45).

When you were born again, an actual change took place in your spirit. It wasn't a mere transformation of your mindset or a shift in your way of thinking. No! You were literally reborn, recreated by the Holy Spirit. That's why the Scriptures affirm, ***"...If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature..."*** (2 Corinthians 5:17). This is a fundamental truth.

Whereas the natural man, the man that's not born again, is of the earth and a mere living soul, you're a life-giving spirit. You bear the image of the heavenly: ***"The first man is of the earth, earthy: the second man is the Lord from heaven. As is the earthy, such are they also that are earthy: and as is the heavenly, such are they also that are heavenly"*** (1 Corinthians 15:47-48). You're a heavenly man. Hallelujah! You're not of this world.

Your life came from the Lord Jesus Christ, the second and last Adam. He's the head of a new race, the new

creation. You're taxonomically different from the natural man. For example, despite sharing the same earthly parents, if you're born again and you have a sibling who isn't, you both belong to completely different realms. Outwardly, you may look the same, but in the Spirit, you are worlds apart.

The one who isn't born again is called darkness while you are called light. The former absorbs light, you radiate it. You emit light, for you're the light of the world, just as the Lord Jesus is called the true light (John 1:9). As He is, so are you in this world (1 John 4:17).

Live in the consciousness of your divine origin and identity in Christ. You're a life giver—radiant, lambent, and divine. Walk in this truth!

CONFESSION

I'm a new creation in Christ Jesus; I'm not of this world. I have the life of God in me. I'm full of grace and truth. I'm a life-giver, radiant, lambent and divine. I walk in the reality of my heritage and identity in Christ, impacting my world with the glory of God. Amen.

FRIDAY 20

BOLDNESS IS OF THE SPIRIT



And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess; but be filled with the Spirit (Ephesians 5:18).

Someone once asked, “How do I develop the boldness or courage to minister the Gospel?” The answer is simple: be filled with the Spirit. If you’re filled with the Holy Spirit, you’ll be bold. In the book of Acts, we see that the Apostles were emboldened by the Spirit. Their confidence wasn’t from human ability but from being filled with the Spirit.

The Bible says in 1 Corinthians 14:4, **“He that speaketh in an unknown tongue edifieth himself; but he that prophesieth edifieth the church.”** The word “edifieth” also means emboldens. The one who speaks in tongues emboldens himself. The more you pray in tongues, the more your spirit is stirred in the Holy Ghost, and the bolder you become.

Think of Simon Peter; before he received the Holy Spirit, he was timid. At the crucifixion, when the Lord was arrested, Peter denied even knowing Him. He was called Simon, a reed, shaken by the wind. But after he received the Holy Spirit, everything changed. On the day of Pentecost, filled with the Spirit, he stood before a massive

crowd and boldly proclaimed Christ. The timid Simon had become Peter the Rock, empowered by the Holy Ghost.

The same Spirit is in you today. Ephesians 5:18 instructs us to be continually filled with the Spirit and also tells us how: ***“Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord; Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ; Submitting yourselves one to another in the fear of God”*** (Ephesians 5:19-21).

When you pray in tongues often, sing spiritual songs, and give thanks always, you stay full of the Spirit. And when you’re full of the Spirit, boldness is natural. You’ll find yourself confidently preaching, teaching, and sharing the Word of God anywhere and with anyone. That boldness is of the Spirit.

PRAYER

Dear Father, thank you for the Holy Spirit who dwells in me and fills me with boldness to preach the Gospel and manifest your righteousness at all times. I’m full of power by the Holy Spirit, strengthened with might in my inner man and invigorated with miracle-working ability as I declare your Word everywhere, leading many to salvation, in Jesus’ Name. Amen.

SATURDAY 21

THE HIGHER REALM OF FAITH



Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen (Hebrews 11:1).

Faith is such an important subject in the Word of God. The Bible says without faith, it's impossible to please God. But what exactly is faith? The Bible gives us the clearest definition as read in our opening scripture. In the Old Testament, what we call faith was often expressed more as trust or confidence in God. They trusted Him to keep His promises, to guide them, to be with them on their journeys.

Abraham, for example, demonstrated this kind of faith by making an unqualified commitment to God, breaking all the limits of trust. But in the New Testament, faith is revealed as something higher and greater. It's not just having the confidence that God "will" act or do something; it's living in the finished works of Christ. It's knowing and accepting that God has done all He ever needed to do for us and acting accordingly.

Therefore, faith being the substance of things hoped for means it's the "materiality" of your hope. It's the

assurance that what you've believed has become real, you've possessed it, irrespective of what your mind or senses may tell you. The Word of God is the evidence that you're who God says you are, you have what He says you have, and you can do what He says you can do. Your response to these and other truths in the Word of God is faith.

That's why we say faith is the response of the human spirit to the Word of God. When you hear His Word, your spirit must grasp it as real because your spirit can see, perceive, and respond to spiritual realities even when your senses can't. That's what God expects of us. It's not enough to trust Him occasionally in one area of life, but to live entirely in this higher realm of faith. Hebrews 10:38 says, ***“Now the just shall live by faith: but if any man draw back, my soul shall have no pleasure in him.”***

CONFESSION

My faith is the victory that overcomes the world. I see, possess, and live in the reality of my heritage, identity and abilities in Christ Jesus. My faith is active, producing results and changing hopeless circumstances for the glory of God. Amen.

SUNDAY 22

THE REALITY OF RESURRECTION



Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and for ever (Hebrews 13:8).

There are those who preach reincarnation, claiming that after death, a person returns in another body, perhaps as an animal, bird, insect, or even another human. But this teaching is unscriptural. The Bible teaches resurrection, not reincarnation. Resurrection is life after death, but it's the same person who's brought back to life by God's power. That is the truth.

Reincarnation is a lie, a false doctrine, but resurrection is God's reality. It's interesting how many believe in what they can't prove. Christianity can be proven. The resurrection of Christ proves His deity. Romans 1:4 says He was declared to be the Son of God with power, according to the Spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead.

That's why His Name still has power today. Whatever He accomplished before He died, His Name continues to do today. The Bible says, ***“Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, and today, and forever”*** (Hebrews 13:8). Furthermore, the Bible says God has appointed a day of judgment, confirmed by the resurrection of Jesus Christ (read Acts 17:31).

The resurrection is the undeniable proof that the Lord Jesus is the appointed Judge. Believing in this truth

excludes the idea of reincarnation. Some misunderstand the words of the Master about John the Baptist, calling him “Elijah.” He didn’t mean Elijah reincarnated as John the Baptist; rather, He meant that John the Baptist came in the power and spirit of Elijah (Luke 1:13-17). If Elijah himself were to appear again, he would still be Elijah, not John.

The Bible also speaks of two witnesses who will minister in Israel during the last days, and many believe one of them will be Elijah, since he never died but was taken alive to heaven (2 Kings 2:11). When he appears, it will not be a reincarnation, but Elijah himself manifesting again according to God’s plan.

How about Moses? The Bible says he died and God Himself buried him (Deuteronomy 34:5-6). Yet, he appeared with Elijah on the Mount of Transfiguration with the Lord Jesus (Matthew 17:1-3). That wasn’t reincarnation either; it was Moses in a glorified, transfigured body, demonstrating the resurrection power of God. Hallelujah!

PRAYER

Dear Father, thank you for the assurance of eternal life through the Lord Jesus Christ. I live in the reality of His resurrection power and look forward with joy to the glorious rapture of the Church and resurrection of the saints. Thank you for the truth of your Word that has made me free to live joyfully in the love, joy, peace, and dominion of your righteousness, in Jesus’ Name. Amen.

MONDAY 23

DOMINION OVER SATAN AND HIS WORKS



Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned (Romans 5:12).

The Scriptures don't give us the impression that all sicknesses and diseases are caused by demons. However, Satan does have a remote connection to sickness because he was the cause of sin from the very beginning, and the Bible tells us that through sin, death entered into the world. Sickness is simply incipient death.

Without sin, there would have been no sickness at all. But some have asked, "If Satan has something to do with sickness, how come doctors are able to cure them?" The answer is simple: Satan is not omnipotent. He doesn't have all the power. He cannot control all of nature, nor can he totally dominate human life. Man still has a will, and man still has authority.

For example, consider the story of the demon-possessed man of Gadara (Mark 5:1-15). The Bible says he had a legion of demons, yet when the Lord Jesus came by, he ran toward Him. If the demons had their way, they would have prevented the man from approaching the Master. But they couldn't stop him because even a demon-possessed man is not 100% controlled by Satan; his will still functions.

This shows that human beings, made in the image of God, are of a higher order than fallen angels. So, any evil or damage caused by Satan can often be undone. If, for example, someone had a car accident through satanic manipulation and the car was wrecked, you can repair the car, and Satan cannot stop it.

If Satan had all the power people imagine he has, he would have destroyed everyone long ago. But he hasn't because he can't. Yes, Satan does cause trouble, but as already stated, much of what he does can be undone through human effort. But where human ability stops, we use the Name of Jesus. The Lord Jesus came to destroy the works of the devil and give us dominion over him and his cohorts of darkness. You have power far beyond human strength, far beyond this world. It's the power of the Holy Spirit. It's the power of the Name of Jesus. Therefore, your authority in Christ Jesus is greater than every force of darkness.

PRAYER

Dear Father, thank you for giving me authority in the Name of Jesus. I exercise that authority over sickness, disease, and every work of darkness. I live in the victory of Christ, knowing that Satan is under my feet; His schemes are futile in and around me, and in the lives of those in my world, in Jesus' Name. Amen.

TUESDAY 24

THE GOSPEL OF DELIVERANCE



That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved (Romans 10:9).

Someone once asked why I don't preach on "deliverance"; I actually do, but not in the way some expect. I believe the Word of God brings true deliverance, and the moment you receive Christ, you're delivered. The Gospel itself is the Gospel of deliverance.

Salvation comes by confessing Jesus as Lord and believing in His resurrection. That confession of His lordship is deliverance in itself because the lordship of Jesus Christ over your life completely broke the dominion of Satan. You can't have Jesus as Lord of your life and, at the same time, have Satan ruling over you; that's impossible.

Now, some worry about what they call generational bondage or curses. But the Bible already gives the answer to that in 2 Corinthians 5:17. It says, ***"Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new."*** That means the problem some Christians have is not bondage but ignorance. There's a mentality some still carry that has kept them defeated, oppressed and in satanic strongholds. But what did the Lord Jesus say, ***"And ye shall know the***

truth, and the truth shall make you free” (John 8:32). The truth is that in Christ, you’ve been begotten into a new life, a living hope by His resurrection. Hallelujah!

When He died, you died with Him. When He was buried, you were buried with Him. When God raised Him from the dead, you were raised together with Him. Now the Bible says, ***“Giving thanks unto the Father... Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son”*** (Colossians 1:12-13).

Thus, the true deliverance is the lordship of Jesus Christ over your life. Now that you’re in Him, you’re seated in the highest place of authority, dominion and power. Ephesians 2:6 says you’ve been raised up together and made to sit together with Christ in heavenly places. Ephesians 1:21 describes this seat of power as ***“Far above all principality, and power, and might, and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this world, but also in that which is to come”*** (Ephesians 1:21). You’re superior to Satan; you therefore don’t need any deliverance from him.

PRAYER

Dear Father, I thank you for my glorious life in Christ and the blessed liberty of the Spirit to love you, fellowship with you, serve you and live for you. Thank you for the victory and dominion I have over Satan and the powers of darkness. I live free, bold, and triumphant every day, walking in the truth of your Word, in Jesus’ Name. Amen.

WEDNESDAY 25

AN AFFIRMATION OF TRIUMPH



I will therefore that men pray everywhere, lifting up holy hands, without wrath and doubting (1 Timothy 2:8).

The Bible enjoins us to pray with our hands lifted. This isn't a mere gesture; it's a spiritual signal of victory, an affirmation of victory. Something happens when you lift your hands in prayer, praise and worship to the Lord.

Think about Moses, when he lifted his hands during Israel's battle with Amalek; Israel prevailed. But when his hands grew weary and came down, the enemy prevailed (Exodus 17:11).

But Aaron and Hur had to wisely improvise to make his hands stay perpetually lifted (Read the whole account in Exodus 17). When the hands were lifted, victory was assured. They discovered something spiritual that worked; something not even commanded in the Law. Then over in the New Testament, Paul reaffirms the same truth as read in our opening scripture.

Lifting your hands in prayer opens your spirit to divine inspiration, strength and power. It makes no difference the challenges you might be facing right now; perhaps this is

what you haven't done consistently yet. Every so often, lift your hands as you pray. Lift them in faith as a sign that you've prevailed.

Sometimes, as you pray, the Spirit of God may even move you to stretch your hand in a particular direction; this is spiritual. Remember Elisha told the king, "Open the window eastward...and shoot" (2 Kings 13:17). It was a prophetic action with spiritual significance.

In the same way, when you lift your hands in prayer, you're enacting victory in the realm of the Spirit; it's an affirmation of triumph. As you pray with lifted hands, utter words by the Spirit, knowing that in Christ Jesus, you're victorious forever. Hallelujah!

PRAYER

Dear Father, I thank you for the power of prayer and the blessing of lifting my hands to you in faith, signalling victory and dominion. By the Spirit, I prevail always; I walk in strength, boldness and endless triumph, in Jesus' Name. Amen.

THURSDAY 26

BUILDERS AND WARRIORS



They which builded on the wall, and they that bare burdens, with those that laded, every one with one of his hands wrought in the work, and with the other hand held a weapon (Nehemiah 4:17).

In Nehemiah's day, as the people built the wall of Jerusalem, they also held their weapons in their hands. They were not just builders but also warriors. With one hand, they built, and with the other hand, they were battle-ready. That's how God's people must be today.

As pastors, leaders, and Christians, we are building the Kingdom of God, but at the same time, engaging in spiritual warfare—battling for the souls of men. This warfare is not fought with guns or swords but with effectual prayer, watchfulness, and the power of words. We must pray and keep praying with fervency, intercede with passion, and make declarations of faith.

Joel 2:15-17 says, ***“Blow the trumpet in Zion, sanctify a fast, call a solemn assembly: Gather the people, sanctify the congregation, assemble the elders, gather the children, and those that suck the breasts: let the bridegroom go forth of his chamber, and the bride out of her closet. Let the priests, the ministers of the LORD, weep between the porch and the altar, and let them say, Spare thy people, O LORD, and give not thine heritage to reproach, that the heathen should rule over them: wherefore should they say among the***

people, Where is their God?”

Notice, it involves everybody, young and old, bride and bridegroom, children and elders; all must be engaged in the Spirit. And then, the ministers of the Lord must cry out, interceding for God’s people. We must stand in the gap so the enemy does not triumph and the nations do not say, “Where is their God?”

We must pray against men or institutions that set themselves to foster persecution of Christians and hinder the spread of the Gospel in the nations of the world. We must thwart such forces and insist that they proceed no further; render their efforts futile, and declare that despite their opposition, the Gospel will continue to spread and prevail.

Don’t be silent or passive. The Gospel must be preached in all nations, and it takes watchful builders who are also warriors to make it happen. Hallelujah!

PRAYER

Dear Father, I thank you for making me a builder and a warrior in your Kingdom. I labour in the Gospel, steadfast in prayer, and watchful in the Spirit. I refuse to give ground to the adversary; instead, I stand strong, interceding for nations, for leaders, and for the Church. Your Word prevails mightily, and the Gospel spreads unhindered in every nation, in Jesus’ Name. Amen.

But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you (Matthew 6:33).

The Lord Jesus said, “...***Take no thought for your life, what ye shall eat, or what ye shall drink...***” (Matthew 6:25). Why doesn't He want you to think or worry about your life? It's because He already sorted and settled everything about your life. He said, “***Behold the fowls of the air: for they sow not, neither do they reap, nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feedeth them. Are ye not much better than they?***” (Matthew 6:26).

You're God's treasure, His most valuable and cherished possession. The Bible says He already knows what's in your heart before you ask Him (Matthew 6:8). He's given you His life, His Name, His nature and His Kingdom. He's given you all things (1 Corinthians 3:21, 2 Peter 1:3).

Now, having given you all things and done exceeding, abundantly more than you can ask or think, He gave a simple instruction: “...***seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness...***” (Matthew 6:33). The key is for you to seek only the Kingdom and then everything else

He's already done for you, or that you could ever desire, will manifest. That's the way of the Spirit.

Refuse to chase after material possessions, thinking life is about what you own. The Lord Jesus said, “...**Take heed, and beware of covetousness: for a man's life consisteth not in the abundance of the things which he possesseth**” (Luke 12:15). What are your pursuits in life? What gets your attention? You already have everything in Christ Jesus; therefore, focus on expanding the Kingdom of God. Focus on the Gospel and the spread of righteousness in the nations.

Houses, lands, influence, wealth, etc., they're already yours. Don't run after them; set your gaze on God's Kingdom only. Make the promotion of His righteousness your passion, your life's pursuit. As you do, all the things others are desperately chasing will come to you without struggle. That's the life of faith; that's the life of the Spirit.

PRAYER

Dear Father, thank you for making me an heir of the Kingdom. Christ is my all, and in Him, I have all things. I refuse to be anxious over material possessions, for I live in your Word and by your Spirit. My only pursuit is the expansion of your Kingdom and promotion of your righteousness to all nations, in Jesus' Name. Amen.

SATURDAY 28

THE WORD IS SEED



Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever (1 Peter 1:23).

Recall that the Bible says the Lord Jesus was born of a virgin. That's humanly impossible but it proved, first, His divinity, and then that the Word of God is seed. Humanly speaking, a child cannot be conceived without the agency of a human sperm; that's where the human life comes from. But God proved something remarkable: the Word He spoke became seed—the Lord Jesus. John 1:14, ***“And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.”***

In Luke 8:11, the Bible tells us that the Word of God is seed: ***“Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God.”*** The Greek word for seed is “sperma,” from which the English word sperm is derived. The Word of God is therefore the life-giving force or faculty, the divine material that carries the life of God.

When God spoke His Word to Mary, she received that Word and it became flesh—Jesus Christ. Now, through the Gospel, that same miracle takes place in us. When you hear the Word and believe it, you receive the seed

of God's Word into your spirit, and that seed produces in you what it talks about. It produces the life of God in you.

No wonder the Bible says, ***"...as he is, so are we in this world"*** (1 John 4:17). The same life that was in Jesus has been imparted to us because we're born of the same Word (seed): ***"Of his own will begat he us with the word of truth, that we should be a kind of firstfruits of his creatures"*** (James 1:18). 1 Peter 1:23 says, ***"Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever."***

We're offsprings of the Word, of the same seed that brought forth Jesus. We're carriers of His divine nature, sharers of His glory and bearers of His righteousness. Failure is not part of your life. You're a life-giver because you're born of the Word of God, which is life. Therefore, your words are spirit and they are life. What is it you desire today in your health, finances, ministry, or family? Speak life. Speak the Word, and it will produce what it talks about. Hallelujah!

PRAYER

Dear Father, I thank you that I am born of your incorruptible Word. Your life is at work in me, producing excellence, victory and glory. I speak words of life, and I see the Word manifest in every area of my life, in Jesus' Name. Amen.

The Word of God gives us clear instructions for living. For example, 1 Peter 5:6-7 says, ***“Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt you in due time: Casting all your care upon him; for he careth for you.”*** What a truth this is! God doesn’t want you burdened with the cares of this life. He tells you to cast every one of them on Him: your worries, anxieties, and concerns.

The Amplified Classic makes this even clearer. It says, ***“Casting the whole of your care [all your anxieties, all your worries, all your concerns, once and for all] on Him, for He cares for you affectionately and cares about you watchfully”*** (1 Peter 5:7 AMPC). Act on the Word; refuse to worry about your children, your family, your job, your finances, or your future.

There’re people who, if they’re not anxious, they think something is wrong. They’ve made worry a lifestyle and even bear worry wrinkles as proof. But that’s not God’s

plan. The life He's given you is a tranquil life, established in peace and anchored in prosperity. He cares for you affectionately and watches over you diligently. He's not watching you to judge or condemn you but to do you good.

The Bible says He rejoices over you with singing (Zephaniah 3:17). He daily loads you with benefits (Psalm 68:19). It should help you understand why He said, "... ***Take no thought for your life, what ye shall eat, or what ye shall drink; nor yet for your body, what ye shall put on. Is not the life more than meat, and the body than raiment? Behold the fowls of the air: for they sow not, neither do they reap, nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feedeth them...***" (Matthew 6:25-26).

Live free from anxiety, and enjoy the peace and rest that comes from knowing, serving, and trusting the Lord.

PRAYER

Dear Father, I thank you for your unfailing love and care for me. I refuse to worry about anything, for in you I have everything. I live in joy and rest, knowing that you watch over me affectionately, loading me daily with blessings and benefits. My life is full of peace, progress, and victory always, in Jesus' Name. Amen.

TUESDAY 31

SEPARATED BY THE SPIRIT



Who hath also sealed us, and given the earnest of the Spirit in our hearts (2 Corinthians 1:22).

1 Corinthians 6:11 reveals something extraordinary about the new creation; it says, ***“And such were some of you: but ye are washed, but ye are sanctified, but ye are justified in the name of the Lord Jesus, and by the Spirit of our God.”*** I want you to notice the underlined word “sanctified”: it means you’ve been separated or set apart by the Spirit.

You’ve been sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise. That seal is a spiritual mark that identifies you as God’s own possession. In the realm of the spirit, you carry a divine signature. This Holy Spirit is also described as the earnest (the down payment or deposit) of our inheritance.

That means God has given you the Holy Spirit as proof that everything He promised in Christ is already yours. If He gave you His Spirit, He has given you access to everything else. The presence of the Holy Spirit in your life is God saying, “You’re mine. You’re distinguished. You’re recognized in the heavens.” Angels see that mark. Demons recognize it. Hallelujah!

2 Corinthians 1:21-22 says, ***“Now he which stablisheth us with you in Christ, and hath anointed us, is God; Who hath also sealed us, and given the earnest of the Spirit in our hearts.”*** This separation is not one of isolation but of distinction. It means you have God’s approval, His authority, and His protection.

You’re set apart from sin, fear, sickness and poverty into a new life of righteousness, peace and dominion. You’re not like the world. You’re in Christ, and Christ is in you. His presence in you is your assurance of victory in this world and your guarantee of eternal glory: ***“To whom God would make known what is the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles; which is Christ in you, the hope of glory”*** (Colossians 1:27). Hallelujah! Live in the consciousness of this truth.


